
Key to the success of this renovation was a sensitive approach, given Emmajane's sentimental attachment to her home. 'Lucy brought empathy to those inevitable trade-offs,' she reflects. 'The greige carpet on which Jasper took his first steps had to go, but the blue velour sofa on which he spoke his first words remains, albeit reinvented with a smart red and cream stripe cover. 'It's a pattern that has a traditional, smart feel,' adds Lucy. 'But in this case, we upholstered the sofa using stripes that run in different directions, which add a more contemporary twist to the look."

The interior designer introduced other elevating details too, such as decorating Emmajane's garden office in soft greens, combined with rich, frond-laden double-faced curtains to create a connection with the natural world, and adding smart piping to the newly upholstered kitchen banquette. Plus with Emmajane and Jasper both being classically trained pianists, she also incorporated their upright piano into the sitting room scheme, building thoughtfully lit bookshelves around it. 'At last, it feels like it has its own place in our home,' reflects Emmajane. We'll often play it for stress relief after a busy day. In fact, newly renovated, the entire house is like

hen Evelyn and Lucas Hart began hunting for their forever home, they certainly hadn't pictured a new build as 'the one'. However, once the estate agent showed them images for a development underway in Surrey, it ticked all of their boxes.

'We were toying with the idea of a renovation, but when we saw the floor plan of this house, it was exactly what we would have wanted from a renovation or self-build, so we knew the opportunity was too good to miss,' says Evelyn.

Formerly based in a beloved two-bedroom flat in Wimbledon village with their son Theodore, the couple craved more space but wanted to move somewhere that had a similar community feel. With the area's thriving village vibe and Lucas'

hired Run For The Hills to ensure that the interiors were tailored to their exact specifications. 'We knew the internal spaces were going to feel big and we wanted to make sure that we didn't lose the sense of homeliness with that,' says Evelyn.

Evelyn and Lucas had a very clear brief - they wanted the spaces to ooze with boutique hotel glamour, heavily influenced by Soho House, while still being a warm and inviting family home. With a number of designs for sultry bars and luxurious member's clubs under its belt, Run For The Hills felt like the perfect match for the project.

'We injected a hotel vibe predominantly through bespoke joinery, including lots of custom banquette-style seating, bar-style units and display counters, as well as through the choices of fabrics, textiles and finishes,' explains Anna Burles of Run For The Hills. 'We kept things contemporary chic, accented with glamorous brass and bronze finishes,



Anna also reconfigured the floor plan slightly by introducing striking green-framed doors to open up the main living and kitchen-dining space, as well as optimising room layouts and furniture configurations to achieve that luxurious boutique hotel feel that Evelyn and Lucas wanted.

She collaborated with the couple to specify a creative mix of tiles and baths, basins, taps and controls in the bathrooms to make sure they felt tailored to them. 'It's made every inch of the house feel like our home as I know the love and attention that was poured into every decision,' says Evelyn.

The expansive ground floor consists of a double sitting room, large study, separate family lounge, playroom, cloakroom and a huge kitchen-diner and snug with views towards the garden. Anna worked closely with the house developer to zone the space

and curate the material choices; sumptuous soft furnishings, reflective surfaces and statement light fittings all contribute to this feeling of a relaxed yet refined atmosphere. Upstairs, each bedroom is designed as its own designated luxury hotel-style suite, with the pièce de résistance being the main suite with its huge lounge area, gold-framed doors and oversized chandeliers.

'While I really loved our little flat, I was live-streaming barre classes from our spare room with terrible internet connection and navigating basement stairs with a pram wasn't much fun, so the extra space has been so incredible for us as a family and totally transformative,' says Evelyn. 'The home barre studio space is a dream come true for me and being able to share this wonderful space with friends and family is fantastic. It's absolutely everything we envisioned and so much more.' \*\*
